

Foreword

POMPON DAHLIAS in which we specialize are small, ball shape in form and for exhibition must not measure over two inches in diameter.

These exquisite little flowers are very popular. They bloom for a long period at least three months here on the Pacific Coast. They do not need the care and attention that has to be given to the large varieties and can be planted quite close together. For either commercial purposes or for the small home garden they will be found very satisfactory.

We exhibited only pompons at the 1930 shows winning many beautiful trophies. We used hundreds of pompons for these displays, having a table 30 x 5 at the Dahlia Society of California in San Francisco and a table 12 x 6 at the Dahlia Society of Southern California in Los Angeles. We received special mention at the Northern show and second prize at the Southern show for the most artistic table. We consider this quite an achievement when you realize we are in competition against the tables displaying masses of the large varieties of dahlias.

The basket of pompons on the cover of this catalog was the prize winner at the Dahlia Society of California and contained Helen Anita and Dee Dee.

NEW POMPON DAHLIAS

The following new pompons of other growers we can recommend. They are all good bloomers, have long stems and are quite different from any former introductions.

Bossy	Very pretty lavender with a darker tone in the center, prolific bloomer and very long stems \$1.00
Bright Eye	Delicate rose pink deepening towards center, very dainty color and a good bloomer
Taka's Purple	Bright carmen, an excellent flower with long stems 1.00
THE FLAPPER	Decided novelty—a bicolor—crimson maroon and cream pink, each flower is different
SALLY	Small shell-like petals of cream delicately flushed pink 1.00

We are not introducing any new pompons of our own this season. We have a number of very excellent new varieties, two of which were prize winners, one at the Dahlia Society of California show and one at the Southern California Show. We find our stock is not large enough to supply the demand there is always for the new pompons and our customers are disappointed after placing orders to find we are sold out, so it seems a better policy to hold them over until the 1932 season. We do not green plant our pompons.

DAHLIA SEED

We are offering again this season a high grade of pompon seed carefully gathered and hand picked.

Dahlias do not come true from seed parents, the hybridizing is done naturally by the bees who carry the pollen from one flower to another—thus producing many varieties no two exactly alike.

We eagerly wait for our seedlings to show buds and then watch each little flower as it opens wondering if it is to be a prize-winner—for they are not all prize winners. It is fun to gamble with the seed and watch the results, even if one only gets a few choice flowers. Try it.

The seed may be sown in flats and transplanted in the open when the weather permits. They will bloom the first season and produce several tubers.

We can furnish pompon seed in the following shades of reds, lavenders, pinks, yellows or in mixed colors.

We are also offering a small amount of seed from the choice large varieties.
